### THE LATEST NEWS

**GOVERNOR:** The Governor did not hold a press conference today, however he did announce the reopening of certain facilities including certain entertainment facilities with health and safety restrictions.

“As I’ve said, Ohioans are able to do two things at once. We can continue to limit the spread of COVID-19 while we safely reopen our economy. It is up to each of us to do what we can to keep each other safe and choose to keep six feet of social distance, wear masks, and maintain good hand hygiene.” said Governor DeWine. “The threat of COVID-19 remains and while it’s our responsibility to keep each other safe, business owners and employees should do their part to ensure customers visit safely, by cleaning and sanitizing surfaces regularly.”

Day camps and residential camps may open at any time. Entertainment venues listed below may open beginning June 10th if they are able to follow Retail, Consumer, Service & Entertainment Guidelines and other applicable additional guidance:

**UNEMPLOYMENT:** The 34,575 new claims bring the total received in the previous 11 weeks to just shy of 1.3 million, according to ODJFS data. That represents about 22% of the state's civilian labor force.

ODJFS reported it has sent more than \$3.5 billion in unemployment compensation payments to more than 668,000 workers and that it has processed 94% of claims for that period.

The U.S. Department of Labor reported about 1.9 million initial claims were made nationwide last week, down from 2.1 million the previous week.

**June 4** - deaths rise to 2,339 total (222 probable), cases rise to 37,282 (2,643 probable)

**June 3** - deaths rise to 2,299 total (219 probable), cases rise to 36,792 (2,584 probable)

**June 2** - deaths rise to 2,258 total (217 probable), cases rise to 36,350 (2,521 probable); Acton signs order allowing non-essential surgeries to resume

**June 1** - deaths rise to 2,206 total (213 probable), cases rise to 35,984 (2,483 probable)

**May 29** - deaths rise to 2,131 total (210 probable), cases rise to 34,566 (2,364 probable); ODH issues updated and revised social distancing and business guidance

**May 28** - deaths rise to 2,098 total (210 probable), cases rise to 33,915 (2,290 probable); DeWine announces efforts to increase testing for communities; Congregate care facilities permitted to do outdoor visitation stating June 8; BWC announced premium deferrals through August

**May 27** - deaths rise to 2,044 total (202 probable), cases rise to 33,439 (2,248 probable)

**May 26** - deaths rise to 2,002 total (199 probable), cases rise to 33,006 (2,179 probable); DeWine launches Congregate Care Unified Response Team

**May 21** – deaths rise to 1,836 total (183 probable), cases rise to 30,167 (1,993 probable); New openings include bowling alleys, batting cages, miniature golf courses, and banquet/catering facilities; Preliminary data from the Minority Health Strike Force released

**May 20** - deaths rise to 1,781 total (178 probable), cases rise to 29,436 (1,919 probable); State discloses data breach of personal information of recipients of Pandemic Unemployment Assistance including social security numbers

**May 19** - deaths rise to 1,720 total (164 probable), cases rise to 28,952 (1,846 probable); DeWine replaces “Stay Safe Ohio” order restricting movement with a health advisory

**May 18** - deaths rise to 1,657 total (153 probable), cases rise to 28,454 (1,808 probable); DeWine announces “Ohio Investigatory Unit” to investigate facilities in violation of safety requirements



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**May 15** - deaths rise to 1,581 total (150 probable), cases rise to 26,954 (1,605 probable)

**May 14** - deaths rise to 1,534 total (146 probable), cases rise to 26,357 (1,557 probable); number of openings announced including campgrounds, gyms, day cares and more
